



84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CAUSE: The undersigned certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe that the heretofore named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this belief is as follows:

Your Affiant is Senior Inspector Jerry Basford of the Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections.

Your Affiant has probable cause to believe between January 2018 and June 2018, Former Florida Department of Corrections Contract Staff Kayla Joy Bryars ("Ms. Bryars") in the County of Jackson and the State of Florida, did commit the following offenses:

On or about January 16, 2018, a bag containing a large quantity of cigarettes were recovered from a work site where inmates typically work. The cigarettes were prepared and packaged in a manner consistent with the cigarettes being introduced into the secure perimeter of a correctional institution. In addition to cigarettes, two rolls of electrical tape and a cigarette lighter were recovered with the cigarettes. A Walmart receipt for the purchase of the tape and lighter was also inside the bag. Ms. Bryars was identified as the individual who purchased the items. Through communication with inmates using contraband cellular telephones, it is evident Ms. Bryars routinely purchases contraband items (i.e. tobacco products) and supplies (i.e. tape) to aid in the introduction of contraband into the secure perimeter of a State Correctional Institution. Evidence suggests Ms. Bryars is responsible for the delivery of the contraband cigarettes, tape and lighter to the inmate work squad site seized on January 16, 2018. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Attempt to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 944.047 (1)(a)(4); and Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39


On or about June 26, 2018, a contraband cellular telephone was recovered at Graceville Work Camp. After review of the contraband device's data, Ms. Bryars was identified routinely communicating with Inmate Beau Emley beginning in November 2017. Much of their conversation involved the arrangement of contraband deliveries to inmate work squad locations in Jackson County, Florida, where work squad inmates would collect the contraband. Some of the contraband delivered by Ms. Bryars was already packaged in a manner consistent with the introduction of contraband while other times Ms. Bryars would deliver plastic bags, Saran wrap, and/or black tape to be used in the packaging process. Included in the correspondence with Ms. Bryars are text message communication and images of the contraband items.

On or about January 25, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. Their communication was about the shipment of a package to Ms. Bryars containing two black taped bundles. The shape and packaging of the bundles are consistent with the introduction of contraband into correctional facility through insertion into one's person. Text messages indicate the black taped bundles contain two ounces of high-quality marijuana. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Marijuana) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; and Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about February 15, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. Their communication involved Ms. Bryars purchasing cigarettes, smokeless tobacco (snuff), and black tape and delivering these items to a location where they could be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 4, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1) and Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215.

On or about March 9, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their conversation, Ms. Bryars is notified of a shipment of contraband items to her residence. The contraband was described as "dope." After receiving the contraband, Ms. Bryars is instructed on how to package the contraband for introduction. After packaging as instructed, Ms. Bryars sent digital images of the contraband to the inmate(s) and delivered it to a location where it could be collected by work squad inmates. The inmate(s) later sent a digital image of the contraband to Ms. Bryars confirming its delivery. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

During their conversation, they discuss the delivery of synthetic cannabinoid ("K2") to Ms. Bryars residence. The text message conversation is corroborated through an exchange of a digital image of a green leafy substance. The communication indicates Ms. Bryars is to deliver the synthetic cannabinoid to a location to be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (synthetic cannabinoid) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

It is evident Ms. Bryars is aware the contraband she is receiving and delivering is being done to profit [REDACTED].

Based on the evidence contained in the message exchange between Inmate Emley and Ms. Bryars, your Affiant has probable cause to believe Ms. Bryars carried out her involvement in receiving and subsequently delivering contraband items to inmate work squad locations for the purpose of the contraband items being introduced into a State Correctional Institution and while doing so was in the furtherance of known illegal gang activity.

Stat., when Ms. Bryars did actually and intentionally attempt to introduce, through unauthorized channels, into the secure perimeter of Graceville Work Camp, cigarettes containing the stimulant nicotine.

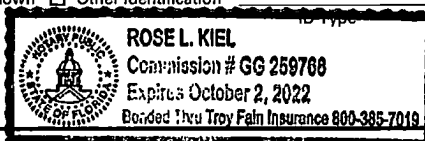

Parish, Assistant State Attorney for the Fourteenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, duly appointed and designated to sign Informations on behalf of Glenn Hess, State Attorney, prosecuting for said State of Florida, in the name and by the authority of the State of Florida, in the County of Jackson, under oath informs the Court that:

COUNT I: Kayla J Bryars, on or about January 16, 2018, in the County of Jackson and State of Florida, did attempt to unlawfully introduce into or upon the grounds of a state correctional institution, nicotine, an intoxicating substance, or take or attempt to take or send or attempt to send therefrom, nicotine, an intoxicating substance, a contraband article, an offense prohibited by law, and in such attempt did an act toward the commission of such offense by , but failed in the perpetration or was intercepted or prevented in the execution of said offense, and committed said offense for the purpose of benefiting, promoting, or furthering the interests of a criminal street gang, contrary to Florida Statute 944.47 and 874.03 and 874.04 and 777.04(1). (F3 – L1)

COUNT II: Kayla J Bryars, on or about January 16, 2018, in the County of Jackson and State of Florida, did unlawfully and without authority, interfere with or interrupt the work of a prisoner or interfere with the discipline or good conduct of a prisoner under the custody of the department, contrary to Florida Statute 944.39.
