84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CAUSE: The undersigned certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe that the heretofore named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this belief is as follows:

Your Affiant is Senior Inspector Jerry Basford of the Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections.

Your Affiant has probable cause to believe between January 2018 and June 2018, Former Florida Department of Corrections Contract Staff Kayla Joy Bryars ("Ms. Bryars") in the County of Jackson and the State of Florida, did commit the following offenses:

On or about January 16, 2018, a bag containing a large quantity of cigarettes were recovered from a work site where inmates typically work. The cigarettes were prepared and packaged in a manner consistent with the cigarettes being introduced into the secure perimeter of a correctional institution. In addition to cigarettes, two rolls of electrical tape and a cigarette lighter were recovered with the cigarettes. A Walmart receipt for the purchase of the tape and lighter was also inside the bag. Ms. Bryars was identified as the individual who purchased the items. Through communication with inmates using contraband cellular telephones, it is evident Ms. Bryars routinely purchases contraband items (i.e. tobacco products) and supplies (i.e. tape) to aid in the introduction of contraband into the secure perimeter of a State Correctional Institution. Evidence suggests Ms. Bryars is responsible for the delivery of the contraband cigarettes, tape and lighter to the inmate work squad site seized on January 16, 2018. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Attempt to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 944.047 (1)(a)(4); and Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39

On or about June 26, 2018, a contraband cellular telephone was recovered at Graceville Work Camp. After review of the contraband device's data, Ms. Bryars was identified routinely communicating with Inmate Beau Emley beginning in November 2017. Much of their conversation involved the arrangement of contraband deliveries to inmate work squad locations in Jackson County, Florida, where work squad inmates would collect the contraband. Some of the contraband delivered by Ms. Bryars was already packaged in a manner consistent with the introduction of contraband while other times Ms. Bryars would deliver plastic bags, Saran wrap, and/or black tape to be used in the packaging process. Included in the correspondence with Ms. Bryars are text message communication and images of the contraband items.

On or about January 25, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. Their communication was about the shipment of a package to Ms. Bryars containing two black taped bundles. The shape and packaging of the bundles are consistent with the introduction of contraband into correctional facility through insertion into one's person. Text messages indicate the black taped bundles contain two ounces of high-quality marijuana. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Marijuana) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; and Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about February 15, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. Their communication involved Ms. Bryars purchasing cigarettes, smokeless tobacco (snuff), and black tape and delivering these items to a location where they could be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 1, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their communication, Ms. Bryars agrees to prepare six cartons of cigarettes and four rolls of black tape and to deliver those items to a location where they can be collected by work squad inmates. Ms. Bryars later indicates she cannot make the drop Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 4, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their conversation, an arrangement to meet another inmate's associate is made. During their meeting, the other inmate's associate provided Ms. Bryars a quantity of cigarettes partially prepared for introducing into a correctional facility. Ms. Bryars is further instructed to purchase black tape and sandwich bags to include with the cigarettes. The conversation indicates Ms. Bryars traveled to a location and delivered the discussed items where they could be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of:

Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 4, 2018, Ms. Bryars, through unauthorized means, sent a digital image to a contraband cellular telephone in the possession of an inmate inside a State Correctional Institution and while doing so used her cellular telephone device. The digital image was of a T-mobile service coverage map including Graceville, Florida. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1) and Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215.

On or about March 9, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their conversation, Ms. Bryars is notified of a shipment of contraband items to her residence. The contraband was described as "dope." After receiving the contraband, Ms. Bryars is instructed on how to package the contraband for introduction. After packaging as instructed, Ms. Bryars sent digital images of the contraband to the inmate(s) and delivered it to a location where it could be collected by work squad inmates. The inmate(s) later sent a digital image of the contraband to Ms. Bryars confirming its delivery. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 15, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their conversation, Ms. Bryars is notified of a shipment of contraband items to her residence. Text messages indicate the contraband is one ounce each of two different kinds of synthetic drugs. The contraband was prepared for introduction prior to its arrival at Ms. Bryars residence. Ms. Bryars asks if the inmate(s) needed anything else, after which they requested one can of snuff and plastic wrap. Conversation indicates Ms. Bryars delivered the contraband items to a location where it could be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (Nicotine) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (synthetic cannabinoid) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 16, 2018, Ms. Bryars, through unauthorized means, sent a digital image to a contraband cellular telephone in the possession of an inmate inside a State Correctional Institution and while doing so used her cellular telephone device. The digital image was a screenshot image of a telephone call she received. Text message communication about the image indicate it was the telephone number of an individual sending Ms. Bryars money for the purchase of a quantity of "Molly" from the inmate. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1) and Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215.

On or about March 21, 2018, Ms. Bryars corresponded through an unlawful contraband cellular telephone with an inmate(s) housed at Graceville Work Camp. During their conversation, they discuss the delivery of synthetic cannabinoid ("K2") to Ms. Bryars residence. The text message conversation is corroborated through an exchange of a digital image of a green leafy substance. The communication indicates Ms. Bryars is to deliver the synthetic cannabinoid to a location to be collected by work squad inmates. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, Drug (synthetic cannabinoid) in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(4); Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1); Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215; Interference with prisoners in violation of s. 944.39.

On or about March 23, 2018, Ms. Bryars, through unauthorized means, sent digital images to a contraband cellular telephone in the possession of an inmate inside a State Correctional Institution and while doing so used her cellular telephone device. The four images sent were of Ms. Bryars when she played high school sports. Your Affiant submits probable cause exists in this instance that Ms. Bryars committed the criminal offenses of: Introduction of Contraband, Written/Recorded Communication in violation of s. 777.04(3) / 944.47(1)(a)(1) and Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device in violation of s. 934.215.
